Dear Bloomfield Hills Resident:

Phase 2 of the 2010 Road Improvement Program has begun and consists of the reconstruction of Lone Pine Rd from Woodward to Cranbrook Rd., Cranbrook Rd. from Lone Pine Rd. to Brady Lane, and the rehabilitation of the Lone Pine Rd. Bridge just east of Cranbrook Rd. A detour to avoid this area has been set up around the City and consists of the use of Quarton Rd., Lahser Rd. and Long Lake Rd. in lieu of Lone Pine Rd. Reducing traffic along Lone Pine Rd. will help the contractor in proceed more rapidly.

If you live along Lone Pine Rd. between Woodward and Cranbrook Rd., property access will be maintained at all times and although you may incur delays due to construction operations, you will always be able to access your property. Please enter Lone Pine Rd. at Woodward. The Lone Pine Road bridge just east of Cranbrook Rd. is under construction and is not passable.

Bridge construction on the Lone Pine bridge has already begun and weather permitting, the roadway reconstruction along Lone Pine Rd. will begin on July 12th. This phase should take approximately one (1) month to complete. Once this phase has been completed the Contractor will move onto Phase 3 which will consist of the reconstruction of Lone Pine Rd. from Cranbrook Rd. to Lahser Rd. The Cranbrook Rd. bridge just south of the Kingswood school entrance is still under construction and will be for at least another month.

In addition to the abovementioned, Consumers Energy, separately from the City's Road Program, have been working along these roads to improve gas service. Even though this work was not completed by the City's Contractor for the 2010 Road Program, they will be following along shortly with the proposed road improvements. If there is a major problem created by the aforementioned utility work the City would like you to contact Hubbell, Roth & Clark, Inc. to discuss the problem and forward to the proper channels if necessary.

In addition to the several open house meetings and multiple correspondences regarding this project, the City is providing frequent e-mail updates to notify residents about the status and progress of the project to all residents that are interested in participating in this form of communication. The City is requesting that any residents that would like to be informed by e-mail about the status of the project and to be provided with updates, should contact Hubbell, Roth & Clark, Inc. listed below to be included on an e-mail distribution list.
